Tia is a 10-year-old refugee from Syria, living in Montreal and struggling to make friends and feel comfortable in her new environment. While her parents are preoccupied with her mother's pregnancy and the challenges of everyday life in a new place, Tia is left mostly to her own devices.

Everything changes when she discovers a magical portal that transports her to Igloodik, a community in the Arctic Circle. There she meets Piujuq, an Inuk girl with whom she quickly forms a deep bond, in spite of their cultural differences. Through their friendship, the stories of Piujuq's grandmother, and their wanderings across the striking northern landscape, the girls are immersed in Inuit storytelling and magic.

A heartwarming magical-realist fable about friendship and discovery, **Tia and Piujuq** is a delightful adventure for all ages.
